Quick Guide: Common Medical Billing Codes Explained

Medical billing codes can feel like a foreign language, but understanding them helps ensure your bills are accurate. Here's a quick reference to some common codes and what they represent.

1. CPT (Current Procedural Terminology) Codes

These are five-digit codes that describe medical procedures and services performed by healthcare providers.

- 99213: Office visit, established patient (medium complexity)
- 90791: Psychiatric diagnostic evaluation
- 93000: Electrocardiogram (ECG or EKG), with report
- 80053: Comprehensive metabolic panel (blood test)

2. ICD-10 (International Classification of Diseases) Codes

These are used to identify diagnoses and reasons for medical visits.

- E11.9: Type 2 diabetes mellitus without complications
- M54.5: Low back pain
- J01.90: Acute sinusitis, unspecified
- Z12.11: Encounter for screening for colon cancer

3. HCPCS (Healthcare Common Procedure Coding System) Codes

These cover products, supplies, and services not included in CPT codes.

- A0428: Ambulance service, basic life support
- E0627: Seat lift mechanism for a patient-operated lift chair
- E0114: Crutches, underarm, adjustable or fixed
- G0463: Hospital outpatient clinic visit

4. Common Modifiers

Modifiers are two-digit codes added to CPT or HCPCS codes to provide additional details about the service.

- -25: Significant, separately identifiable evaluation and management service on the same day as another procedure.
- -59: Distinct procedural service, indicating a procedure or service was separate from others performed on the same day.
- -RT: Procedure performed on the right side of the body.
- -LT: Procedure performed on the left side of the body.

Tips for Reviewing Medical Codes

- 1. Match Codes to Services: Compare the codes on your bill to the services you received.
- 2. Use Online Resources: Websites like the AMA's CPT Lookup or CMS's HCPCS database can help verify codes.
- 3. Look for Red Flags: Be wary of duplicate codes or services you didn't receive.
